Key tasks

- Develop and communicate the position of the sector on relevant issues, working closely with the industry expert members of the relevant EFCC working groups.
- Manage the technical working group activities. This task includes drawing up agenda, preparing the technical aspects of the meeting, drafting the minutes, following-up the agreed actions.
- Initiate and manage specific projects supporting the industry in sustainability, circularity and sustainable chemicals policy, in coordination with the relevant EFCC expert group.
- Establish and maintain relationships with the key regulatory bodies, partner industry associations and relevant stakeholders with similar priorities to represent
